For this book in the IMAGES OF AMERICA series, the Society's Photograph Committee carefully selected, from our collection of over 9000 local photographs, over 200 pictures of great interest. They show the County from the timbering region in the North around Jamison City to the coal mining at Centralia in the far South in the period 1870 to 1920.

Every aspect of life in the County's earlier days is depicted, including workers making canal boats and wagons, youngsters at school playgrounds, Bloomsburg Fair on race day, a citizenship class of Russian immigrants, and even a ten-rider bicycle and ostriches at a feather farm. Coverage includes canals, street scenes, clubs, parades, early autos, and principal public buildings.

Each photograph has a caption with a few intriguing details about the place, persons or activity shown.
