

DISCOVERING BLOOMSBURG: a bicentennial history

An official publication of Bloomsburg's Bicentennial Commission, *Discovering Bloomsburg* is the first book devoted specifically to the history of "the only TOWN in Pennsylvania." The book was a collaborative work by twenty authors covering various aspects of the town's development. *Discovering Bloomsburg* is not a definitive work that encompasses all aspects of the town's two hundred years, but rather is a "slice of history" that enables readers to get a "feel" of the community. The book covers the period when native Americans dominated the Fishing Creek and Susquehanna Valleys, the role of the Eyer brothers, Ludwig and John, in establishing a settlement that became Bloomsburg, major events in transportation, and economic, political, and educational developments of the town, plus different aspects of community life.

This fascinating 288-page history includes 4 maps and over 50 photos, with an index and bibliography.
